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### Overview

Snowmobile tours are 1 to 1.5 hour guided tours beginning from the Basecamp area. They require a ratio of 1 guide and up to 10 clients per tour.

### Objectives

To identify the unique challenges in operating this attraction while maintaining best practices for infection prevention and control (IPC) and maintaining routine cleaning of high contact surfaces.

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Identified Risks	Mitigation Strategies
Risk 1: Shared materials. Helmets, goggles, and snowmobiles are common use between tour groups.	Strategy 1: Complete cleaning of all shared materials following use.
Risk 2: Close contact during check-in and safety briefings.	Strategy 2: Safety briefings and check-in procedures will be conducted following physical distancing protocols.

A *risk* is defined as a practice or procedure that results in close contact between individuals, use of shared surfaces/devices, increased probability of respiratory droplet aerosolization, or increased probability of physical injury.

**Trip Procedures:**

1. Customer Briefing and Waiver Signing
  - a. All customers will be screened with the PEAK RSEQ placard on arrival to TAG premises prior to trip departure.
  - b. Guides will provide safety briefing following check-in. Employees and customer groups will be required to wear face coverings during check-in and safety briefings.
1. Activity Procedures
  - a. Guests will be issued a full-face helmet and goggles.
  - b. Guests will be provided a snowmobile safety briefing in groups no larger than 10 guests for each guide.
  - c. Tour will commence.
  - d. Upon return to Base, guests will return equipment to designated areas for cleaning by TAG staff.
2. Cleaning Guidelines
  - a. Helmets
    - i. Helmet interiors will be disinfected with disinfectant wipes approved for use for COVID-19. Sufficient contact time should be allowed for proper disinfection. Contact time for disinfectant wipes is determined by the manufacturer.
  - b. Goggles
    - i. Goggles must be cleaned following each client usage. Goggle foam which contacts the guest face will be disinfected with a disinfectant wipe product approved for use for COVID-19.
  - c. Operator controls

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- i. Operator controls should be disinfected using household disinfectant spray and wipes in accordance with general disinfecting best practice in **2.2 Cleaning and Disinfecting Procedures**. Operator controls should be disinfected between uses between different guests.
- d. Non-contact Surfaces (mirrors, exterior of Snowmobile, etc.)
  - i. External surfaces are sufficiently low risk for harbouring and transmitting respiratory droplets that they may be cleaned in accordance with standard cleaning timelines (i.e. When visibly soiled).

**Implementation Plan**

Training needs: All staff must complete PEAK COVID-19 IDMP course. Written test for proof of due diligence.

Quality assurance: Training and PEAK oversight.

Materials needed: 1 x non-medical mask per operator, cleaning/disinfection materials.

Oversight: Ongoing external audit by PEAK project management.
