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Overview

Snowshoe tours are guided and conducted with a ratio of 1 guide to a maximum of 10 guests. They require transportation in a Ranger vehicle for 15-30 minutes depending on tour booking. Tours last for 1.5-2 hours depending on booking. The activity is a non-strenuous walking activity with low inherent risk of transmission for COVID-19.

Objectives

To identify the unique challenges in operating this attraction while maintaining best practices for infection prevention and control (IPC) and maintaining routine cleaning of high contact surfaces.

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Identified Risks	Mitigation Strategies
Risk 1: Activity is low risk for known transmission dynamics of COVID-19. See 3.6 <i>Transportation in Ranger Vehicles</i> for mitigation strategies for transportation.	Strategy 1: Maintain physical distancing and customer screening procedures. Require the use of non-medical face masks in base area when physical distancing cannot be maintained.
Risk 2: Activity utilizes some shared materials including snowshoes, hiking poles, gloves, and boots.	Strategy 2: Guests are encouraged to bring their own gloves and boots. Hiking poles are cleaned between uses. Snowshoes are cleaned at end of day or when visibly soiled.

A *risk* is defined as a practice or procedure that results in close contact between individuals, use of shared surfaces/devices, increased probability of respiratory droplet aerosolization, or increased probability of physical injury.

Trip Procedures:

1. Customer Briefing and Waiver Signing
 - a. All customers must be screened with the PEAK RSEQ placard on arrival to TAG premises prior to self-guided tour departure.
 - b. Employees and customer groups will be required to wear face coverings during check-in and safety briefings.
 - c. Customers should be instructed to use non-medical face masks if physical distancing cannot be maintained during guided tour.
2. Cleaning Guidelines
 - a. Boots
 - i. Boots will be sprayed or wiped with a disinfectant product approved for use for COVID-19 between guest usages.
 - b. Gloves
 - i. Gloves will be laundered between guest uses.
 - c. Snowshoes
 - i. Snowshoes will be disinfected at the end of day or when visibly soiled.
 - d. Hiking Poles
 - i. Hiking poles will be disinfected between uses by different guests.

Implementation Plan

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Training needs: All staff must complete PEAK COVID-19 IDMP course. Written test for proof of due diligence.

Quality assurance: Training and PEAK oversight.

Materials needed: 1 x non-medical mask per operator.

Oversight: Ongoing external audit by PEAK project management.
